

The Day of Pentecost, in the British tradition called Whitsunday, is the fiftieth and final day of the Easter season. One of the principal feasts in The Calendar of the Church Year (see page 15 in The Book of Common Prayer), it celebrates the outpouring of the Holy Spirit upon the apostles and the establishment of the Church through the preaching of the apostles and the baptism of the thousands who on that day believed in the Gospel message. The day emphasizes that the Church is understood as the body of Christ, which is drawn together and given life by the Holy Spirit. It also marks the start of the longest season of the liturgical calendar.
